Was made known by the message of an angel,

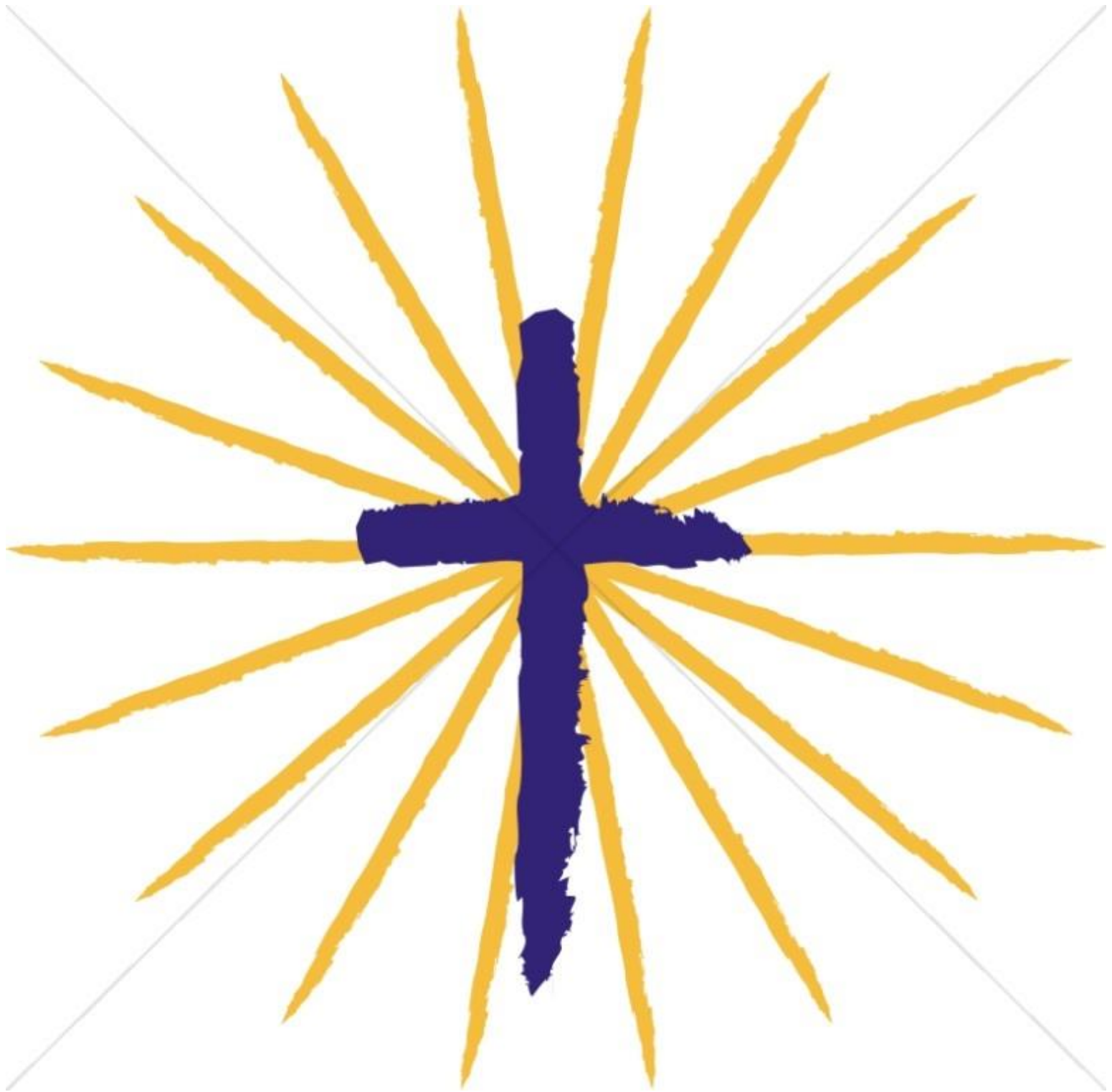
May be brought by his passion and cross
