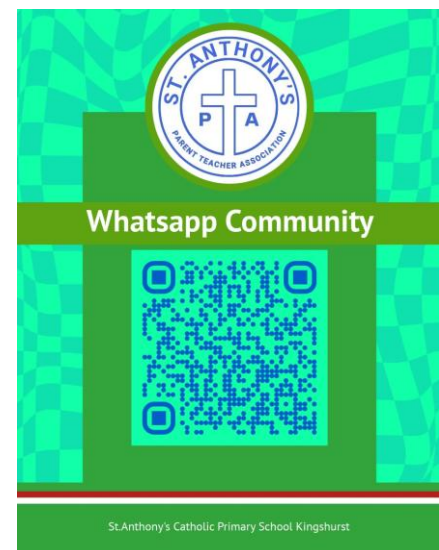

This week we have been looking at how much taller we are now from when we started Tiny Ants in September. We are super ready for Nursery - understanding how to line up. We listened to the story *Spot Plays Football*, we asked Mrs Cleary if we could paint rainbows, and Freya, Penelope, Cayson and Ozzy enjoyed playing together, choosing toys of their own interest.



Nursery

This week in Nursery we have focused on the story *The Three Billy Goats Gruff*. We acted out the story using props and have taken on different rolls in our play. We also joined in with all of the repeated phrases such as “trip, trap, trip trap” and “Who’s that trip trapping across my bridge?”.

Reception

This week, we read the story Little Red Riding Hood. In English, the children wrote brilliant descriptions of the deep, dark woods and used their imaginations to describe a trap that Little Red Riding Hood could set to catch the Big Bad Wolf. In RE, the children have been writing and sharing their own prayers, reflecting thoughtfully on their conversations with God. In Maths, we explored the properties of shape by comparing, sorting and rotating 2D shapes to create pictures of different animals. It has been a sport-filled week! On Wednesday, the children thoroughly enjoyed our nursery rhyme-themed sports day. They showed fantastic teamwork, determination and resilience, never giving up and cheering each other on as they raced. We also had a visit from a GB athlete, who led an exciting sports session and shared some top tips for running. The children learnt different running techniques, played a variety of games and took part in a relay race!



Year 1

Year 1 have had a busy week! We enjoyed a visit from a Great British athlete and had our own PE lesson with him, and the children loved all of the games they played. We also had a fantastic celebration of the word as the children's ideas and contributions were so thoughtful and inspiring! Year 1 were great in sports day and worked so well in their house teams to cheer each other on through each station!



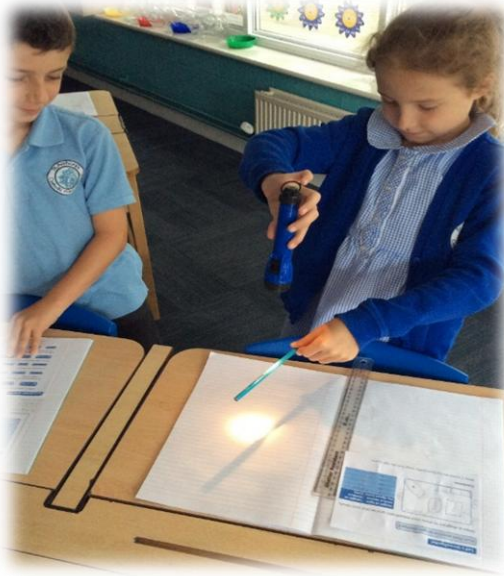
Year 2

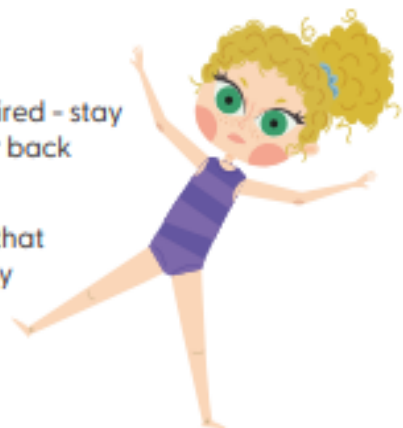

Does your child worry about going to school? Do you feel you have tried everything to ensure your child attends school, but nothing seems to be working? Do you feel there has been a relationship breakdown with your child's school? Do you have general questions around school attendance?

Important information for Parents and Carers

Notification Regarding Extended Absence from School

We are writing to remind parents and carers of the school's legal responsibilities regarding pupil attendance.

Under the Education (Pupil Registration) Regulations, schools must notify the Local Authority when a pupil has been absent from school for **15 school days or more**, whether those absences occur:

- **Consecutively** (15 school days in a row), or
- **Cumulatively** (15 school days in total over the academic year).

This notification requirement applies regardless of whether absences are authorised or unauthorised and is intended to help ensure that children receive appropriate support and access to education.

School Absence

If the reason for absence is due to illness, **medical evidence may be requested** to support this, please send; screenshots of appointments, prescriptions or any other supporting correspondence.

Remember to call the **school absence line** to advise of your child's absence and include their symptoms, reasons of; **'unwell', 'tired' or 'under the weather'** do not give school enough information about your child's illness.

We kindly ask all families to be honest about the reason for any absence. It is not fair to put children in the difficult position of feeling they must hide the truth about where they have been. Transparency helps us to maintain trust and ensures accurate school records.

We would like to remind all families that **Leave of Absence requests must be submitted to the school office at least four weeks in advance** of the proposed absence date.

Please note that, in line with government guidance, **holidays during term time cannot be authorised**. However, if your child will be absent from school for any reason, you are still required to complete a Leave of Absence request form so that we can record the absence appropriately.

Early Help Coordinators

They review and screen assessments, provide tailored advice to families, and support Designated Safeguarding Leads and other pastoral staff with Early Help.
